Where will I get to visit? How do I sign up?

- Events at local colleges such as the Big Bang STEM event, Stepping Stone Workshops and Open Days (if they fall within the college timetable)
- You can put your name down on the Careers & Transitions notice board, tell your teachers, or speak to the Careers & Transitions Team. You can also discuss this at your annual review and during your Careers Interview.
