Our favourite book this half term has been The Very Hungry Caterpillar.















We did travel training with Daniel and Claire. I found it to be really enjoyable, and I feel I have learned a lot from it. We learned about road safety, what you might encounter when travelling, and how to deal with it. We learned about different areas to cross, like how you should try to cross where there aren't cars blocking your view, but if you cannot find another area where it's safer to cross, you should go in between the cars and stick your head out slightly to check if it's safe to cross, then cross normally.

We also learned about the helping hand card that you can have to tell the driver of a bus that you may need further assistance, such as if you aren't very stable on your feet. You could have it displayed on the card so the driver knows to wait till you have seated or held onto a poll.

I found it very informative, and I have learned a lot from it. I can now read a digital and physical bus timetable with far more confidence. I also learned that you can ask for a bus information receipt that tells you about the current bus you are on. I feel much more confident with the idea of travelling more independently because of these sessions.

If I were to change anything about these sessions, I would have liked to have more information about trains, as we talked a lot about buses and travelling on foot but not as much on the topic of train travel. The sessions also felt extremely long, so maybe movement breaks or something to split up the activities would have been a welcome addition.










College Maths

Year 11 have been studying electricity this term. They've made a range of series and parallel circuits and measured current and voltage.










<u>Year 10</u>
