



Leavers Destinations

Every student (100%) who left Woodlands Meed in 20/21 went into education, employment or social care. No students were NEET (Not in education, employment or training) and 2 students (8%) went in to employment. In relation to the two individuals moving into employment; both were supported by the Meed's Job Club.

This year saw a wide and varied range of destinations with Crawley College being the most popular choice with over 25% of students choosing this destination.




Course Levels

Covid-19 Impact


Covid-19 did not affect the collection of destinations for this cohort.

2 Years Post Woodlands Meed




Leavers Destinations

Two years post Woodlands Meed sees students retaining their further education/social care placements. Two individuals have become NEET; 1 was placed into employment by the Meed's Job Club the year they left, and completed over a year of successful employment with a partner company but decided to move on so they could work closer to home; the MJC is in contact and offering support. The other NEET individual moved on to a further education college, however this was not sustained and the MJC have offered support.



Colleges Breakdown

Two years on and the split remains even with Crawley College remaining the most popular choice.

Two years post Woodlands Meed sees an increase in students moving on the study beyond entry levels which demonstrates progression.






Leavers Destinations

Three years post Woodlands Meed sees some movement in settings and an increase in training with 1 individual doing an apprenticeship with Ford motors. Three years post Woodlands Meed sees a reduction in the number of individuals who were NEET last year, with 1 passing his driving test and returning to his place of employment. The other NEET student has returned to education and is studying at Brighton MET.
