



Leavers Destinations

97% of students who left Woodlands Meed in 21/22 went into education, employment or social care. One student was NEET (Not in education, employment or training) – work is ongoing to plan a transition to Sense Learning. 2 students (5%) went in to employment. In relation to the two individuals moving into employment; 1 was placed by the Meed's Job Club and the other went to work in their family business.



Colleges Breakdown

This year saw a wide and varied range of destinations again, with Crawley College being the most popular choice with over 41% of students choosing this destination. 69% of students moved on to a further education college within the Chichester College Group.




Course Levels

The vast majority (82%) of students went on to study at entry level with 9% moving on to level 1 courses and the remaining 9% moving on to study at level 2.


Level 2 Courses: Games Development at DV8 Sussex, Music at BIMM, Creative Media at Crawley College.

Year 2 post Woodlands Meed data collection: 10 families did not respond which equates to 27%. As a result, this could effect the accuracy of the data. 3% of individuals are NEET which equates to 1 individual and work continues with the family to transition them into an independent learning provider. 8% are in employment, with the rest maintaining their places at education, training or social care settings.



Colleges Breakdown

This year saw a wide and varied range of destinations again, with Crawley College being the most popular choice. Brinsbury College comes in as the next most popular setting.



Course Levels

The vast majority (77%) of individuals continue to study at entry level. Progression to higher levels is evident in this cohort with individuals moving up the levels on their chosen pathways.

Level 2 Courses: Animal Care at Brinsbury College, Games Development at DV8 Sussex.
