Relationship and Sex Education Key stage 5

As you are aware, Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) became a statutory part of the National Curriculum in September 2020. As part of our school's wider Personal, Social, Heath and Economics Education (PSHE) programme, your young person will receive RSE lessons.

The purpose of the curriculum is to provide knowledge and understanding of safe and healthy relationships, based on respect. We have designed a positive curriculum to help students understand all aspects of their health, including their relationships and sexual health, and how this relates to their lives now and in the future.

During the spring term the year 12 pupils will learn about 'Relationships and Sex – Sexual Health Choices', this unit includes the follow content:

•How to make informed decisions about sexual health and access reliable advice and support

•Sexually transmitted infections and how to reduce chances of transmission

• How to choose and access contraception

•The consequences of unintended pregnancy and how to access appropriate support

The first lesson will be an assessment of the pupils so that we can further tailor the learning to meet their needs and we can find out what they would like to know more about in RSE. The last lesson will also be an assessment to establish what the students have learned and to allow the staff to evaluate with the students how to improve RSE lessons in the future.

You may find that your young person asks questions about a topic at home, and therefore you may want to take the opportunity to discuss topics with your young person.
